OMSC Race Officer Checklist

From Home

Book Assistants for 9:15 at Club Watches x 2, Voice recorder, Range Finder Waterproofs, Life Jacket and Boots Binoculars, Phone and Glasses Sun cream, Water, Hat Towel, Rag, Duct tape

At Club - 9:15

Check Notice of Race for start times and Starting Sequence (5/4/1 or 3/2/1 GO) Check signing-on Sheets and Pens are out Agree course with QM / any other event RO

Take On Committee Boat - 9:45

Horns Whistle Recorder Compass

At the Start - 10:10

Check course still set true to wind Port bias on line 5-10 deg, check for Race 2 Course boards, with No. of Laps

Committee Boat on Station - Orange Postponement - Answering Pennant +2 Up Down +1

Warning after 1 min +1 Individual Recall - X+1

Down + 1 (Wed) then... Warning after 1 min +1 Shorten before leader rounds - S +2

Committee Boat Finishing - Blue (+1 if timed) Record boats seen in starting area (if poss)

Record who starts in each start (if poss) Record number of Rounds = times through start/finish line, with time of leader / last Record finishing times (ex Lasers on Sun) Start line must not be crossed downwind

Start line 1.25 times total boat length. 150m

Courses (Open meetings)

Spacer mark 8-10 boat lengths across and to leeward of windward mark Leeward gate 8-10 boat lengths wide

Symmetrics: 90 degree at wing mark No spins: 60 degree all angles

- As per board Avoid exclusion zones - Lead boat guide

- Warning H on 5, P on 4 and 1, Go Number change and sound See your or higher number, Go

Individual recall X for 30 secs General recall 1st Sub and +2 mins - Line not part of course after start

- On rhum line up and down wind
- Sail through line - Or will be finished at a mark
- Or by dory motoring past
- Listen for whistle!

Schedule **Team** Finish: General recall - 1st Sub +2 Up - Time = 2 hours Down after 2 mins + 0 (Sun) - Line set in front of lead boat

Race Officer – Sets course, times start, sounds horn, sights the line for recalls, calls sail numbers

Assistant RO 1 – Flags and recording

Assistant RO 2 (Sundays) - Timing, flags, recording

Safety 1 – Sets course marks

Safety 2 – Sets start / finish marks

Duty Officer – Advises on sailing area

Rules Advisor – Clarifies rules, resolves disputes












Trapezoid Course N

Important factors affecting race management

Clean winds – keep clear of windward shores

Enough space

Course areas not overlapped

Away from Exclusion Zones

Talk to Safety One re position of marks


Race Duration and Limits

Target race length

- 45 minutes for leader (40-50 minute range)

Time limits

- DNS after 4 mins Sun, 15 mins Weds
- 75 minutes for first finisher
- 15 minutes from first to last
- Introducing Whiskey flag for tail enders



Start Line Length



Number of boats x length of the boat plus 10% to 50%



QM recommended multiplying factor 1.25

Sunday

1 Laser = 4.25 m

24 Lasers = 100m

x 1.25 = 125m

x 1.50 = 150m

Wednesday

1 average boat = 4.5 m


30 boats= 135m

x 1.25 = 170m

x 1.50 = 200m

Setting the Start Line





Send rib away downwind to right distance then upwind to drop. 1 to 2 rib lengths = 5 degrees

Check boat for X, 1st Sub, W and Course Boards

Race team briefing

Radio checks with Safety / QM

On station

Check boat hooter

Raise Orange flag

Bend on all flags






Time keeping is the most important role!

Starting Penalty Zone and OCS





Starting Procedures R/A



P – default no penalties apply Display X if OCS at start

Z – rule 30.2 applies20% scoring penaltyRecord as ZFP if in triangle in last minuteDisplay X if OCS at start



Starting Procedures R/A



U - rule 30.3 applies

Record as UFD if in triangle in last minute Don't display X if OCS at start
May start a re-started race

Black – rule 30.4 applies

Record as BFD if in triangle in last minute Don't display X if OCS at start


Must **NOT** start a re-started race



Individual Recall




Identify those boats that are OCS



Individual Recall



Display X






Record each boat OCS

Watch the boat(s), if they return delete OCS from record Leave displayed for 2 minutes if they do not return When all returned remove X (without a sound signal)

General Recall



When unable to identify all boats that are OCS



General Recall



Display 1st Sub





Use when:-

several unidentified boats OCS

or if there is an error in starting procedure

Recalled fleet goes to end of start sequence

Restart only when you are ready

Adjust start line if needed

May change P to Z, U or Black penalty flag

Starting Procedures R/A

Race Officer commentates on boats OCS

Race Officer or assistant records boats OCS

Race Officer communicates with pin end safety boat

It's the Race Officer's decision re clear line, individual recall or general recall



Flags and Sounds Exercise

Sunday 3-2-1-0 flag sequence

Individual and General recall

Use of voice recorder

Monitoring the Race

Observe the fleet throughout

Time legs/laps and calculate finish times

Watch for casualties not spotted by safety


Watch for commercial traffic – barges

Prepare for the next race especially if wind has shifted


- Locate a spare windward mark ready to re-flag
- Move pin end start mark or adjust committee boat anchor
- Change number of rounds on course boards

Sunday Finish Line





Wednesday Finish Line



Shorten Start line to become Finish line




Directio n from last mark ➤ Boats must cross the finishing line in the direction of the course from the last mark

Shorten Course



Display S





Displayed from committee boat using S flag or S board Boats must pass the leeward mark to port and sail to the finish line

Display over class flag(s) if not shortening all classes

Use when:wind dies

Finishing Procedures 4

Hoist Blue flag ahead of first finisher

Record all who cross the finish line

- Sunday: Lasers not timed, All other boats are timed
- Wednesday: All timed

Cross check during lulls and at the end

Taped records can be very useful to essential

Hoots / whistles optional but welcomed by sailors

Broken halyards on the committee boat


Barge approaching the beat at start....

Display AP






All races not started are postponed Can only be used **before** the start If Postpone on land, not less than 30 minutes to restart

Abandon Racing



Display N





The race started is Abandoned, return to the starting area.

'N' displayed alone cannot be used before the start

Use when:-

errors in the course, dangerous or foul conditions, major wind shifts, late recognition of errors in start sequence, wind vanished, etc


Rarely used on water. Use on land if no wind by 1 hour after race time on Sunday and 30 minutes on Wednesday. Then go!


After Postponement, General Recall or Abandonment

Remove 1 minute before warning signal

After Racing



All flags back in box – in right place
Tidy committee boat
Results promptly to office

Debrief

Personal assessment

Group assessment

Get feed back from competitors

After Racing



In support of a Protest

Ensure that protest time limits are observed

Be helpful to competitors even if they are requesting redress from the race committee

Tell the facts as you observed them

Do not argue with, challenge or question the competitors - Leave it to the jury!

Radio Protocol



"Safety 1, Safety 1, this is Club Race - Over"

"Go ahead Club Race"

"Safety 1 pls move the windward mark – Over"

"On my way – Safety 1 out"

"Club Race, Club Race this is Safety 1 – Over"

(Message arrives while you are busy) "Stand by Safety 1"

(When you are free) "This is Club Race, Go ahead Safety 1"

"Am at windwark mark, which way to move it – Over"

"200 metres West, will tell you when - Over"

"Copy that – Safety 1 standing by"






PREPARATORY SIGNAL




When? warning + 1

ONE MINUTE SIGNAL


