On the day – before you go afloat

Race Team



Race Officer – Sets course, times start, sounds horn, sights the line for recalls, calls sail numbers

Assistant RO 1 – Flags and recording

Assistant RO 2 (Sundays) - Timing, flags, recording

Safety 1 – Sets course marks

Safety 2 – Sets start / finish marks

Duty Officer – Advises on sailing area

Rules Advisor – Clarifies rules, resolves disputes

Onshore Preparation

[In advance - check Dutyman for other team members and agree meeting time at Club.]

Report to office on arrival at Club

Confirm Duty Officer, safety team, sailing area Collect Race Box and radio

Agree course with safety team (position/size)





Important factors:

Clean winds – keep clear of windward shores

Enough space – use available water to best advantage

Leave room to swing course if possible

Course areas not overlapped

Away from Exclusion Zones and barges



Windward – Leeward – Triangle


1P – 3P is round one and subsequent odd numbered rounds.

Wednesday Course K




Course K - Triangle

Timed race duration.

Start and finish on the beat.

Course

1P - 2P - 3P and cross start/finish line upwind. Start/finish line downwind is an obstruction. Repeated until blue flag is hoisted.


Course L – Windward/Leeward

Timed race duration.

Start and finish on the beat.

1P – 2P and cross start/finish line upwind. Start/finish line downwind is an obstruction. Repeated until blue flag is hoisted.


Course N - Trapezoid

Timed race duration.

Start and finish on the beat.

Course

1P - 2P - 3P - 4P and cross start/finish line upwind. Start/finish line downwind is an obstruction. Repeated until blue flag is hoisted



Wednesday Course P




Course P – Reverse P

Timed race duration.

Start and finish on the beat.

Course

1P - 2P - 3S - 4P and cross start/finish line upwind Start/finish line downwind is an obstruction. Repeated until blue flag is hoisted.

Radio Protocols



"Safety 1, Safety 1, this is Club Race - Over"

"Go ahead Club Race"

"Safety 1 pls move the windward mark – Over"

"On my way – Safety 1 out"

"Club Race, Club Race this is Safety 1 – Over"

(Message arrives while you are busy) "Stand by Safety 1"

(When you are free) "This is Club Race, Go ahead Safety 1"

"Am at windwark mark, which way to move it – Over"

"200 metres West, will tell you when - Over"

"Copy that – Safety 1 standing by"











Layout of Flags and Halyards





Number of boats x length of the boat plus 10% to 50%



QM recommended multiplying factor 1.25 – 1.50

Sunday

1 ILCA = 4.25 m

24 ILCAs = 100m

x 1.25 = 125m

x 1.50 = 150m

Wednesday


1 average boat = 4.5 m

30 boats= 135m

x 1.25 = 170m



Judging Start Line Length



Setting the Start Line





Send rib away across wind to right distance then upwind to drop, [x] rib lengths = 5 degrees


Aim to synchronise with real time.

RIB to watch the pin end

Starting Penalty Zone and OCS






Starting Penalties



Note: I Flag - not used at QM



P – default no penalties apply Display X if OCS at start



Z – rule 30.2 applies20% scoring penaltyRecord as ZFP if in triangle in last minuteDisplay X if OCS at start

Starting Penalties



Note: U Flag preferred to Black for Club Racing



U - rule 30.3 applies

Record as UFD if in triangle in last minute Don't display X if OCS at start
Boats UFD may start a re-started race



Black - rule 30.4 applies

Record as BFD if in triangle in last minute Don't display X if OCS at start Boats BFD Must **NOT** start a re-started race Must display BFD boat list from committee boat




Identify those boats that are OCS



Individual Recall



Display X





Record each boat OCS.

Watch the boat(s), when they return delete OCS from record.


If all returned remove X (without a sound signal). If not:

Display for 4 mins (5-4-1-0 start) or 2 mins (3-2-1-0 start)

General Recall



When unable to identify all boats that are OCS



General Recall



Display 1st Sub





Use when:-

several unidentified boats OCS

or if there is an error in starting procedure

On Sundays the recalled fleet goes to end of the start sequence

On Wednesdays (2022) the whole sequence restarts

Restart only when you are ready

Adjust start line if needed

May decide to change P to U penalty flag

Starting Procedures A

Race Officer commentates on boats OCS

Race Officer or assistant records boats OCS

Race Officer communicates with pin end safety boat to ID OCS boats

It's the Race Officer's decision re clear line, individual recall or general recall


Race Duration and Limits

Target race length

- 45 to 55 minutes for leader

Time limits – Sundays

- 75 minutes for first finisher
- 15 minutes from first to last but with RO discretion
- Introducing Whiskey flag for tail enders



Monitoring the Race A

Observe the fleet throughout – record laps Time legs/laps and calculate finish times Watch for casualties not spotted by safety Watch for commercial traffic – barges


Prepare for the next race especially if wind has shifted

- Locate a spare windward mark ready to re-flag
- Move pin end start mark or adjust committee boat anchor
- Change number of rounds on course boards


Displayed from committee boat using S flag and/or S board Boats must pass the leeward mark to port and sail to the finish line

Display over class flag(s) if not shortening all classes

Use when wind dies


Sunday Finish Line





Wednesday Finish Line

➤ Aiming for 45 minutes for first finisher



Direction from last mark ➤ Boats must cross the finishing line in the direction of the course from the last mark

Finishing Procedures 4

Hoist Blue flag ahead of first finisher – no sound Record all who cross the finish line - HULL

- Sunday: ILCAs not timed but time last boat to finish, All other boats are timed
- Wednesday: All timed

Cross check records during lulls and at the end

Taped records can be very useful/essential

Sound signal for first boat (in each fleet) only.

Record any OCS, UFD, NSC etc. boats



Display AP






All races not started are postponed Can only be used **before** the start If Postpone on land, not less than 30 minutes to restart

Abandon Racing



Display N





The race started is Abandoned, return to the starting area.

'N' displayed alone **cannot** be used **before** the start

Use when:-

errors in the course, dangerous or foul conditions, major wind shifts, late recognition of errors in start sequence, wind vanished, etc


If racing is entirely abandoned before the start (e.g. due to wind conditions) use AP over A on land ~1 hour after race time on Sunday and ~30 minutes on Wednesday.






After Postponement, General Recall or Abandonment







Remove 1 minute before warning signal

All flags back in box – in right place
Tidy committee boat – switch off horn
Results promptly to office

Debrief

Personal assessment

Group assessment

Get feed back from competitors

After Racing



In support of a Protest

Ensure that protest time limits are observed

Be helpful to competitors even if they are requesting redress from the race committee

Tell the facts as you observed them

Do not argue with, challenge or question the competitors - Leave it to the jury!




