→ Sailing, Keelboating and Windsurfing

We run a regular dinghy racing programme throughout the year on Sundays and also on Wednesday evenings in the Summer. Our Saturday Club and Keelboat Club help introduce newer sailors to sailing together and racing.

We have an active windsurfing and wing foiling fleet who take advantage of our open water to experience the "best sea sailing in Town".

→ RYA British Sailing Pathway Club

We have recently been recognised as an RYA British Sailing Pathway Club under a new Royal Yachting Association programme to identify and develop clubs around the UK to provide affordable, excellent sailing and coaching for junior racers.

We provide a comprehensive training programme for adults as well as children throughout the year. In 2024-2025, 765 adults and 1,575 children took part in courses.

→ Sailability

Our RYA Sailability programme, run entirely by volunteers, operates from Spring through to Autumn.

On Thursday mornings, we provide on-water sailing experiences for children from special schools and community groups who have additional needs.

Thursday afternoon sessions are for adults with physical or learning disabilities and include opportunities to take part in competitive racing if they wish.

We want to increase local community involvement including by pursuing diversification into other watersports activities – e.g. rowing, paddling.

In pursuit of our environmental sustainability goals, we need to implement renewable energy initiatives.

Club Projects



- ➔ **From replacing boat covers**
- ➔ **To refurbishment of changing rooms**

We have a range of desired investment projects to enhance our facilities, accessibility, and sustainability. Small projects include replacement covers and seats for six Sailability boats. Medium-scale initiatives cover the installation of a winch for East Side Sailability boat launching, and an internal accessible toilet.

Larger projects focus on improving accessibility and facilities, such as replacing the external platform disabled lift with an internal lift, and a major refurbishment of changing rooms to add cubicle showers, a dedicated under-18s space, and maintain adult facilities. In support of our environmental sustainability goals, and subject to roof survey and landlord consent, we would also like to install solar panels to reduce operational costs.
